The attachment between an infant and a loving parent or caregiver creates a lasting sense of security and safety for the child, which allows for optimal growth and development. When the attachment relationship is disrupted, children feel insecure, unsafe and anxious. Many difficulties experienced by individuals throughout the life span can be traced back to disrupted attachment relationships. An understanding of this important issue is offered in this certificate program. The participant will be trained in attachment theory, self regulation and techniques related to age specific attachment
