Modified Interaction Guidance is a strengths based Attachment Intervention that focuses on improving the relationship between caregiver and child.

Originally developed by Dr. Diane Benoit, an infant psychiatrist at Toronto Hospital for Sick Children, Modified Interaction Guidance has been very successfully used in hospitals, child and family services agencies, community counseling centers, and in client homes.

Staff at the Aulneau Centre have trained extensively in Attachment theory and interventions, and have expanded and developed MIG into a very effective intervention that combines assessment, counselling, coaching, and psycho-education. Based on the Atypical Maternal Behaviour Instrument for Assessment and Classification (AMBIANCE), our training incorporates elements from a broad range of Attachment research including Circle Of Security (COS) and the Dynamic Maturational Model of Attachment (DMM).

MIG involves 8 to 10 sessions where parents observe themselves interacting with their child on video, and with the support and guidance of the therapist, highlight points where the interactions are positive and 'working' and discuss some of the interactions where the parent missed cues or was unable to calm and comfort the child. We have found this intervention to be very effective with all of our client groups, including those that have limited capacity for insight or have cognitive disabilities, including parents diagnosed with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder etc.

This training will be of greatest value to counselors, therapists, social workers, mental health professionals, who work directly with parents (primary caregivers) and children age 2 – 12.

About the presenters:

Jean MacKinnon holds a Master's degree in Counselling from Gonzaga University, Spokane Washington (1995). She has 22 years experience providing play therapy to children, and offering parenting, family and couple therapy. In the last seven years, Jean has become trained in attachment theory and treatment and now offers both treatment to families and training to professionals.

Csilla Przibislawsky holds a Master's degree in Drama Therapy from Concordia University, Montreal, and has twelve years professional experience working as a Drama Therapist. Csilla has also specialized in Attachment assessment and interventions, and has been a certified trainer in Modified Interaction Guidance for the past 6 years. She presently works with families, individual children, youth and adults, and provides trainings in Attachment to professionals and students.

Training Program will include:

- Attachment Theory and MIG—Practice basics
- Assessment in MIG: Using the Adult Attachment Interview (AAI) and The Working Model of the Child Interview (WMCI)
- Functional formulation of case plans
- Using psycho-educational resources and providing feedback to clients
- Observation skills and common themes in MIG
- Introduction to AMBIANCE, coding caregiver behaviours
- Using video equipment and ideal set-up for MIG

This course has been pre-approved by the

Continuing Education Credits:

Each participant will receive a certificate of participation which may be used to qualify for eligibility for Continuing Education Credits when submitted to your own licensing board and/or professional college or association.

Admission Requirements:

- Prerequisite: *Attachment Treatment: Theory and Techniques[®]* Level 1 and 2 or equivalent.
- Clinicians working with an active caseload which includes children and families.
- Master degree in Counselling, Psychology, Social Work, or Marriage & Family Therapy or equivalent is preferred. Consideration will be given for those with Bachelor degrees combined with relevant experience
- Applicants must be prepared to work with two families from their caseload. The first family must be ready to begin work at the beginning of December, 2011.
